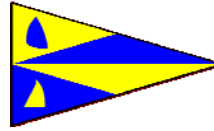


VINTAGE YACHTING GAMES

From all around the world we get enthusiastic reactions from the countries. Many of them already led to entries.

Since the 1936 Olympics no Swedish O-jolle sailor sailed any mayor regatta. The Finn sailor Kristian ADERMAN picked up the challenge chartered an O-Jolle in The Netherlands and will defend the yellow and blue Swedish flag in Medemblik.

Portugal's 1992 Soling representative, Antonio TANGER, immediately responded to the idea of the Vintage Yachting Games. After being absent in the class for more than a decade, the Vintage Yachting Games was the opportunity he was waiting for. A charter boat was easily found in Hungary. His team will use the European Championship in April to get in to shape.

David WILKIS (IRL) FD silver medalist in Tallin (1980) wrote: "I have received information from you and have been positively promoting the event in the UK association with Richard PHILLIPS.

Bidding process for Vintage Yachting Games 2012 opened



Three countries have volunteered to do the bidding for the 2012 edition of the Vintage Yachting Games. In alphabetical order it are: France (Cannes), Hungary (Lake Balaton) and Italy (Lake Como).



In the bidding process also the future Vintage Classes like Tempest, and some Metre classes will have a say in this . There combined vote will count as one. Each of the current classes will also have a vote.



The decision will be made at July 22nd. The announcement to the sailing community will be made during the Vintage Yachting Games 20-27 September 2008 in Medemblik

A bit of history 1928: 12' Dinghy class

Designed by George Cockshott, an amateur boat designer from Southport, over ninety years ago, the International Twelve Foot Dinghy became the first one-design racing dinghy to gain international recognition. Today it is virtually forgotten in the United Kingdom, but the class still enjoys a sizeable following in the Netherlands, Italy and Japan, and is regaining popularity elsewhere.

This class was used for the second time as an Olympic Class in 1928 during the Amsterdam Olympics.
